- Isaiah 45:1, 4-6      We are to worship God alone, the God who calls us by name.
- 1 Thess 1:1-5b      The Good News came to you not only as words, but as power and as the Holy Spirit.
- Matthew 22:15-21      "Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

Isaiah speaks of Cyrus in our first reading today. Cyrus was a king of Persia who conquered Babylon and liberated the Jewish people. In this reading, we see that it was the Lord who called Cyrus into action on behalf of the Jews. God is the Lord, and that there is no other. Saint Paul draws our attention to the fact that we are loved by the God who chose us in Christ. In the Gospel, as Jesus argues with the Pharisees, he readily admits that there are other priorities in life, like paying taxes, but it is God who should be first in our attitudes and actions.
