CATHEDRAL NEWS

Fr John Hughes, Rector of the Pontifical Scots College Rome, has been named Chaplain of His Holiness with the title Monsignor.

Fr John, a Glasgow priest, is 65 years of age, and qualifies under new regulations to be named a Monsignor.

He has been Rector of the Scots College Rome for 5 years. Before that, he was Vice-Rector of Scotus College Seminary in Bearsden. Previously, he was for many years Chaplain and Lecturer at St Andrew's College of Education, which educated teachers for Catholic schools.

At the 12 noon Mass today, Archbishop Philip Tartaglia will present Father Hughes with the parchment with which Pope Francis designates Monsignor John Hughes to be a Chaplain of His Holiness.

Archbishop Tartaglia commented: "I am delighted for John. This award recognises Monsignor John Hughes' distinguished service to Catholic teacher education and to the formation of priests."
