Luke 12:13–21 Avoid greed in all its forms.

Today's readings are a wonderful antidote to our culture's attitude that the accumulation of material wealth should be everyone's goal. This notion is 'Vanity of vanities,' for what guarantee is there that you will ever be able to enjoy all the wealth you worked for? Greed is idolatry, Paul says in the next reading; instead seek what is above. After all, Jesus points out in the Gospel, the rich man is a fool for thinking he can control the rest of his life through wealth. May today's readings offer a strong argument against the worship of material possessions.

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

This church was built in 1816 to serve Glasgow's rapidly expanding Catholic population. Following the restoration of the Catholic Hierarchy of Scotland in 1878, St Andrew's became the Cathedral of the restored Archdiocese of Glasgow. In April 2011 a major renovation was completed, providing the Cathedral with fresh décor, artwork and an innovative cloister garden. Today it is a popular city church, offering tranquillity for busy lives, as well as a fitting venue for the important liturgical events of the Archdiocese. Thank you for your presence and for your support.

A time of change: Canon Sharkey will be leaving the Cathedral at the beginning of September to take up a new position as parish priest of Our Holy Redeemer and St. Margaret's, Clydebank. Canon Andrew MacKenzie, currently parish priest at St. Joseph's, Tollcross will become the new Administrator of the Cathedral.

Due to ongoing health issues, it was agreed that Fr. Walsh should also leave the Cathedral around the same time as Canon Sharkey. This will be another major change and upheaval, since he has been here for more than 15 years and has been a sure and steady presence. As we thank him for his dedicated work and prayer, we also pray that his health recovers and that he will be able to continue his ministry in the Archdiocese in some form in the future.

CATHEDRAL NEWS

Parish Bulletin: Whilst we endeavour to produce a weekly parish bulletin, this may become periodical over the remainder of the summer. However, we will do our best to keep you up to date with parish and Archdiocesan news.
