Following the restoration of the Catholic Hierarchy of Scotland in 1878, St Andrew's became the Cathedral of the restored Archdiocese of Glasgow. In April 2011 a major renovation was completed, providing the Cathedral with fresh décor, artwork and an innovative cloister garden. Today it is a popular city church, offering tranquillity for busy lives, as well as a fitting venue for the important liturgical events of the Archdiocese.
